FILM PHOTOGRAPHY

When shooting Portraits, I use my specialty or as I like to call it my secret weapon, which when I shoot using soft, diffused lighting. Mainly because it conceals skin blemishes, reduces the shadows around the subject and overall just softens the picture, making it look dreamy or nostalgic. Also, my portraits tend to draw attention to the subject, not just one feature. Because of the soft lighting, the whole picture is kind of neutral. People find it harder to use me than my sister because I can't be automatically regulated., but it does help you develop your photography skills.

DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY Well, when I shoot Portraits, my specialty is capturing every tiny detail, especially when I use hard lighting. Because my pictures have a higher resolution, it's easier to see all the aspects of the subject's face. Most of the time, my photographs tend to draw attention to the eyes. Mainly because the rule of thirds, but also because of the high resolution and the blurred out background. I've usually got built in features like different kinds of filters, custom white balance etc. And once you're done clicking the picture, you can easily transfer it into a computer to do further editing

and touch ups.

FILM PHOTOGRAPHY Yes one is clearly more harsher than the other.

DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY When shooting fashion, my high resolution is handy. With me, the colours pop. They are vivid and eye catching. People tend to focus more on the colours than the actual subject, so it's important to highlight it. I'm best suited for modern clothing, with striking colours, designs and patterns. I'm used more for fashion than film photography is.

FILM PHOTOGRAPHY When I shoot fashion, my colours are softer, and the whole image looks faded, but in an aesthetically pleasing way. I'm perfect for shooting models with vintage clothing, or brands that are going for a classic look. Emily Soto does an excellent job in capturing fashion using film. In fact, she shot an entire campaign using me.

FILM PHOTOGRAPHY

The most beneficial camera to use in landscape photography is the Fuji GW 693. This camera takes six by nine negatives and is a medium format. It's perfect for landscapes. This is all dependent on the camera but to reference, we will use photographer, Teva Cosic's picture. In the composition, the colours are vibrant and saturated without being too harsh, the image itself looks a little grainy. The composition includes the middle ground, foreground and a background, to portray how vast it is. She has placed the subject to the left of the frame to show how huge the scene is in comparison to them. Maybe it's the camera's filter or maybe it's done in post-production, but there is a blue filter in the image that really makes the scene more eye-catching.

This image on the other hand, or as I like to call it, the better image, is shot using me. The colours pop more and the contrast is pretty vivid. As you can see there is a low shutter speed which makes the water appear blurry. The image is softer, making you feel more relaxed. The focal point in this image are the rocks at the bottom. The viewers eyes are immediately drawn there. Overall my way is probably the easier way to go about clicking pictures.
